Beginner's Guide: Club Race 'Loonacy' . . .

A re you a member who has seen all the information about the Club Race in Nord Stern, but has never taken in the event? Not sure what you need to do to attend, what goes on, and how to go about taking it in? Here is a quick and dirty guide to attending your first "Loonacy".

Where? Brainerd International Raceway; 6 miles north of Brainerd/Baxter on Highway 371. If you don't dally, you can make it in 2 hours from Maple Grove. Enter at the main gate. You can't miss it.

When? August 6th—8th. Practice on Friday. Saturday features more practice, the practice starts and fun race, and then a 60-minute enduro. Sunday morning is qualifying, afternoon

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the sprint races. Late Sunday is our famous "Total Loonacy" inverted start race (handicapped start with the slower cars getting a head start.)

How much? There is no charge for admittance. You will sign a waiver of liability and that's it. If you are a Porsche enthusiast, there is simply no reason to miss out on this.

What do I do? First thing you want to do is turn left after the gate and follow the road to the paddock area where all the cars are. Park anywhere and wander around to check out the cars. I'd suggest your first stop be the information tent (the big tent on your left) and check out the displays there and say "Hi!" to the folks there. Be sure you get a schedule so you know what is going on. Then go check out the cars. Not just the racecars, but also the transporters and the other spectator's cars. There is a lot to see. Don't be afraid to strike up a conversation

So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??!

A *brief* sysnopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

Autocross: A driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

Concours: A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity.

Driver Training: A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skill and technique on an actual racecourse. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions.

Stillwater, MiNDriver Education: High speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd,
Blackhawk Farms) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Instruction
is available. Mounted fire extinguisher is required, performance enhancements are
frequently made (but not required!).

Time Trials: On course timed lap with controlled starts and exiting.

PCA Club Racing: Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle required.

Rally: An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

Social: Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat and drink beverages! See our motto on page 1!

Tech Session: Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/mechanical knowledge!

Chip and Tale: Part II . . . all it takes is courage!

"With good lighting you will see the peak of the paint bubble getting dull and matching the dull surface around the chip. When your dome is almost flat, STOP (in the name of love) because we are now going to switch to a polish to finish the job." When we left off last month, our valiant hero had just finished applying the paint to the chip area. Feeling refreshed and full of vigor, we now start the sanding of your Porsche's paint. Look out, domes.

Mr. Pat advises that 2000 grit sandpaper and water does a great job of leveling off the paint "dome" which you have just created. Now, those faint of heart turn to the autocross section as this is where COURAGE is required. As you sand the top of the dome down



you will also be sanding just the top of the surrounding good paint. The surface will go dull (just like yr hmble srvnt) and you will think you are destroying your good paint job. Don't worry, be happy, as the polishing discussed below will bring the entire surface back to life and better than new! Just don't be AHNOLD and put a lot of pressure on the 2000 paper as you are going back and forth. Pat uses his "middle" (!!) finger to gently "float" the paper on the water. Yes, you too (middle finger or otherwise) can feel the surface as it levels out. Just take your time and if you practiced on your wife's car or the neighbor's "beater" you will sense when you are getting near level. Keep the surface wet , be PATIENT and you will be happy, Pat guarantees.

With good lighting you will see the peak of the paint bubble getting dull and matching the dull surface around the chip. When your dome is almost flat, STOP (in the name of love) because we are now going to switch to a polish to finish the job.

3M Imperial hand Glaze, Blue Magic Metal Polish and your favorite wax are going to bring your paint surface back to better than factory new. One of the secrets Pat learned from John Paterak was to use Blue Magic metal polish along with 3M Imperial Hand Glaze to polish out really dull surfaces. Both of these products are available at Pep Boys (ask for Moe, Larry or Curly) and should be part of your standard supplies anyhow. Take a clean cotton rag and lay a bead of the hand Glaze (about 2 inches) on the cloth and then lay a corresponding bead of Blue Magic next to it. With your finger (middle?) mix it on the surface of the rag and then start polishing the paint surface. Another trick here is to polish in one direction – the direction that wind travels over the surface when driving. AJ advises he applied driver's to passenger's side, as part of his weekly "drifting" exercise. Later on you will do the entire surface this same way. It will take a few applications but this will take the dullness out of the new and surrounding paint. It may take a few times but it will work and you will see the paint color on your rag. Next, shift to just the Hand Glaze to final polish the surface. The problem is now the newly painted and polished areas will look better than the rest of the hood or fender. So polish the entire panel with the Hand Glaze. If there are areas where birds or acid rain have done damage, go back to the 50-50 mixture of glaze and Blue Magic.

Chip . . .



Most beginners think that wax is what makes the car shine. It is the paint surface preparation and polishing that makes the shine, the wax is merely the protector. Different waxes work on clear-coated paints better than others but that may be a topic for another day (thanks, Pat, you just gave me another topic idea) Just don't apply the wax on too thick. Thin coats work better.

A few years ago Pat splurged and bought a new 993 and told the dealer not to prep it and just give it to him without the porters' machine polishing as part of the predelivery preparation. By washing, polishing and waxing consistently following the direction of airflow over the car, it developed a deep rich shine that got a comment even from Peter Porsche who asked what color it was? (c'mon Pat, get serious! J) Just a standard Guards Red, Pat advised. So keep your rags going in a back and forth motion and you will eventually see a difference. This is especially important on black or dark paint. All of those spider scratches will disappear and maybe Peter Porsche will ask you what color your P car is at your next concours event!

with anyone you meet. We are all enthusiasts and love to talk about our hobby!

Where do I watch the races? Feel free to go almost anywhere in the paddock and the infield. The exceptions are the hot pits and the track itself. Be sure to climb the stairs and watch a bit from the top of the main tower building. You'll get a great view of much of the track. Make your way into the infield. There are two ways to get into the infield. Next to the main tower is a pedestrian tunnel that goes under the track to the grandstands on the other side. From there you can go anywhere, but remember the track is 3 miles around so it's a pretty good walk to turn 3. The other alternative is to drive around the infield. Just go back toward main gate and when you get close to the gate you will see a bridge on your left. Go over the bridge and you're there. Top of the grandstand at turn 4 is an awesome place to watch because you can see much of the track.

What do I do after the races? Come back to the paddock and visit with the drivers. They will be excited about the race they just ran and be more than happy to talk. The only stupid question would be, "*Are you having fun?*"

What do I need to bring? Camera, sunscreen, an umbrella/raincoat, maybe food or drink but the concession stand is open. Alcoholic beverages can be brought into the track, but cannot be consumed until after the last checkered flag falls for the day. This includes all areas of the track.

Where do I stay? Rooms are tough in the Brainerd area at this time of the year. Start calling around now.

Can I camp? Camping is readily available in the paddock and in the infield and also free. There are showers available. Motor homes are welcome.

How can I spend my money? Check out the information tent.
