A *brief* synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

**Autocross:** A low-speed driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

**Concours:** A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity.

**Driver Training:** A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skill and technique on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions. *A Pre-Requisite for Driver Ed participation and NOT to be confused with Driver Education events.* 

**Driver Education:** High speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd, Blackhawk Farms, Road America) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Prior Driver Training participation is required. Performance enhancements are frequently made (but not required!).

Time Trials: On course timed lap with controlled starts and exiting.

**PCA Club Racing:** Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle required.

**Rally:** An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

**Social:** Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat and drink beverages! See our motto on pg. 1!

**Tech Session:** Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/mechanical knowledge!

**ClubTalk/TechTalk:** E-mail listservs for member subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions as well as a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Get last minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. See Nord Stern's website for directions on how to subscribe.

#### 2001 996 No Power Increase

Thought this was an interesting tech question and am forwarding it to the list.

**Question:** I upgraded my totally stock 996 with B&B Headers and Muffler, Evo Air Intake, and an Upsolute ECU Upgrade. The car was put on the dyno before and after the modifications. I actually "lost" 2 horsepower! The shop that installed the mods other than the computer upgrade had no explanation. I had that done while living in Atlanta. I now live in the Orlando area and am using a local shop for maintenance. They told me the Porsche engines are built at such a high level of high performance from the factory that these upgrades don't offer much of a gain. I find that hard to believe. Is it possible Upsolute accidently "detuned" my computer? The car drives great and performs well but I certainly expected to get better performance for all the money spent. Any ideas??? Thanks.

**Answer:** If you read some of my previous answers to this sort of question, you will know that I am not surprised at your report. Basically as I've said repeatedly, over the years Porsche has left less and less "on the table" in terms of easy power increases. I also say that the only way to know what you're getting is to dyno the car before & after. The next step could be to systematically work through the combinations. For example try the stock exhaust, or another brand of exhaust, and see if that makes any difference, with the other changes still on the car.

I know a lot more about the pre 964 cars than I do about the new ones, and there's always things on the table to work with from that era of 911 for performance up-ticks. That said, the newer stuff is much tougher to extract gains from. A few years back Ruf did a big work up on the then new Boxster and after all their tedious labor and flow analysis of the exhuast system extracted something like a whopping 3 horsepower over factory. Not a knock on Ruf but rather a testament to the factory engineering. I've noticed in general that gains can always be made over factory in one area or another, but overall driveability is likely to suffer somewhere else as a result. A goal that must be kept in mind when doing any mod...ask yourself what problem am I trying to solve? I would bet the mods below offered a quicker rev or shifted the power curve one way or the other, but didn't really do anything for the guy's butt dyno.

If he really wants to make his 996 quicker, put it on a diet and ditch a couple hundred pounds.

Very interesting and it is certainly true that the NON TURBOCHARGED Porsches are difficult to wring much more power out of, I would have expected to have some HP increase, say 12-20 hp??? Turbo Porsches are a different story, My old '91 911 Turbo responded very well to the old 1 bar boost spring and headers/muffs/no cats. The modern 996 Twin Turbos (like I have) respond VERY well to ECU and exhuast system change and that generally yields an increase from 415 hp to 485 hp (70 real horsepower). I saw my 60-130 mph go from 12.8 seconds (stock) to 10.96 seconds, which confirmed approximately 70 hp increase.

y 2005 GT3 did 348 hp (400 crank hp) to the wheels on Evo's mustang dyno completely stock. After their software upgrade, Milltek Headers, high flow cats and mufflers and intake, it did 372 to the wheels (428 to the crank).

I do agree that most normally aspirated cars do not gain much power from these sort of modifications, but my particular set up was tested on other cars prior to mine with the same results. The gentleman with the original question chose to use a B&B muffler and upsolute (ECU piggyback tuning) which would not have been my first choice, however, I beleive that most of the power on my car was gained from the headers.

## Changes To New Proposed Rules . . . Passing Rule Change

Passing may be accomplished on any straightaway where the driver of the car being overtaken feels that the pass can be completed before the turn in point for the next corner and with reasonable safety. No pass may be initiated until the passing signal has been clearly given by the driver of the car being passed. It is the lead car's responsibility to watch his or her mirrors, select a proper passing zone, signal the driver of the overtaking car and slow sufficiently to allow the pass to be completed safely before the turn in point of the next corner. The car being passed shall drive on the driving line. Do not follow to closely, regardless of the speed differential. Following to closely is dangerous and may result in the driver's expulsion from the event.

#### WINDOWS DOWN

Windows shall be down on either side where there is an occupant when on the track. It is strongly encouraged to install a window net on the driver's side.

#### PASSING SIGNAL

The driver of the car being overtaken shall signal an overtaking car with a hand signal to initiate a pass. The hand signal shall be a pointing gesture of either the left or right hand with the arm extended. A left pointing signal shall extend the left hand/arm out of the driver's side window in a manner to be clearly seen by the overtaking car. A right pointing signal shall be done by keeping the right hand/arm inside the car in such a manner to be clearly seen by the overtaking car. The driver of the overtaken car should use animated signals of the hand/arm to enhance the communication of the driver's intent. The pointing signal to the left means the overtaking vehicle shall pass on the left, and a pointing signal to the right means that the overtaking vehicle shall pass on the right.

Since some of the cars have roll bars or safety cages which will obstruct some view of the driver in the car being overtaken, the driver should make every effort to make a clear and obvious signal. The wearing of colored gloves is encouraged to make the hand signal more visible.

A separate signal shall be given for each car when there are multiple cars in line for passing. An overtaking car may not pass unless a clear and obvious signal has been given to that overtaking car.

The overtaking car, when given an invitation to pass, is responsible for moving off line and safely completing the pass on the side directed by the overtaken vehicle. If required, the overtaken car must slow sufficiently to allow the overtaking car to make a safe pass. No passing is allowed unless there is a proper hand signal inviting a pass, and the overtaking vehicle has no obligation to pass and may decline the invitation.

With temps in the 70s, local atmosphere and recent track renovation, Steve Rashbaum (F), the national sponsor coordinator, fired off a personal record in the Fat Rabbit 951, three seconds better than his prior best, taking the 14th class position in the deep Green sprint. Keith Clark, race chair, found time to crank up a Turbo as well, for the fastest lap, fourth overall and a podium in F.

Van Zelst experienced the other side of the spectrum in the Orange enduro, when he joined Ray Van Zelst, to co-drive a 1955 356 (GT6S) with its horsepower somewhere under 100 for 36th place out of 53 entries.

But when the last names differ, co-driving plans are sometimes made at the last minute, with those sans car (for whatever reason) or with similar machines being picked up by other generous car owners. Greg Gatlin, who won twice at Texas this year, spanned the stints of both enduros and jumped in three different racecars: the Cups of Gerald Isbell (GTA) and Barry Moore (GTC3), and the RS America of Wally Ruiz (D). His best finish was the bridesmaid spot he earned with Ruiz, overall and within class, in the Gold enduro.

Front-engine drivers and volunteers both, Rashbaum and Chris Inglot, Zone 13 Rep and prior TRAC co-chair, also shared a Class-F ride in the Enduro. Because volunteers race, PCA racing stays in touch with its drivers!

him by a friend and in as much as Patti Mascone (PR for PCA's Club Racing program) features several Nord Stern members and Chicago names familiar to a number of us Nord Sterners, I thought it appropriate to ask her permission to reprint the write up here in Nord Stern. She was more than happy to share her follow up on last Labor Day's annual DE and Club Race as hosted by Chicago PCA - an event the Boeders rarely miss! What a track, what a beautiful area in Wisconsin and who doesn't love both the Osthof and Siebkens Resorts - which are only two of the many outstanding places to stay in this gorgeous and historic area. Always a fitting 'end' to the summer season.

Ikhart Lake boasts one - of only two - open road, racing **L**circuits listed on U.S. historic registries (along with the town of Watkins Glen). It's a storied Wisconsin road map that inspired the building of Road America, whose 14 turns - including the kink - pay homage to the wide-open landscape. Bruce Boeder (racer rather than steward this time around), reports the feeling was "mellow" at Chicago Region's 2006 Road America Challenge (TRAC), Labor Day weekend, as Jay Culbertson - fresh off Baja 1000 off-road testing - worked his next-to-last PCA club race as steward.

Between deployments to Iraq as an F16 pilot, John Poor, a national scrutineer, also worked this event, where fully one-third of the 150 entries were various GTs, either heavily modified Porsches or factory racecars. Even with all the altered, upgraded, heavyduty Porsches, Boeder says that only one major incident (due to a mechanical problem) occurred, so drivers shined, including several PCA volunteers, many of whom reside, fittingly, within

reach of this racing mecca. One thing all the Porsches could take advantage of over the four-mile course was throttle. Through the kink, Jerry Greene (1992 Euro Cup, GTC1, #92) went door to door with Claudio Kaempf (1970 911, GT4S), finally completing a pass there on the fourth lap by using more than the track. Kaempf then responded with a third overall in their Blue group sprint, with Greene one spot behind, winner of the Porsche Cars North America Corner Worker's Choice award.



Bob Van Zelst, who struggled mechanically all weekend in GTP (the classification for tube-frame, prototype or atypical Porsches), attacked a tough Red field after starting last, making it back up to 11th. John Crosby (GTC3), club racing chair, drove the 2005 Cup, #3, to third overall, second in class.

## What's New From PCA . . . Time to Update E-mail!

PCA is very excited to announce two new on-line tools to assist club officers in communicating with their Region as well as organizing events.

The first new tool is on-line event registration. Our region, Nord Stern, is already utilizing this tool with having just completed our first driving event of the year, First Fling, requiring all registration via the web. It can be accessed at: http://clubregistration.net/. Key features include:

- Registration for any type of event, while it can be used for complicated events like DE's and Club Races, it can just as easily be used for a dinner meeting or a tech session. Club Racing has already adopted it as their preferred method for registration
- Members will create a profile and then never have to enter that information again
- Car numbers are saved for future events
- Run groups can be assigned
- Accepting credit cards through PayPal is an integrated feature which makes it easy for your Region as well as members
- A variety of reports are available
- Available 24/7

ClubRegistration.net was developed by Chris Alvarado of the Hill Country Region working closely with both the PCA Website Committee and Club Racing. We thank Chris for all his hard work on this and Chris is making it available at no charge to those Regions who wish to use it.

Secondly, we are very excited about the new Emailer. It gives Regions officials (specifically the region president and membership chair) the ability to e-mail all their Region's members in the PCA membership database who have not opted out of receiving e-mails. This tool allows PCA to have more frequent and more immediate contact with its members.

Key features of the Emailer are:

- Region Presidents and Membership Chairs have the capability of e-mailing all members in their respective Regions. Zone Reps can e-mail everyone in their zone
- Membership chairs can easily e-mail new members as well as those who have recently dropped their membership
- Region Presidents and Membership Chairs can e-mail their Region management team
- The editor allows for the president and membership chair to quickly send simple e-mails, but will also allow you to create very sophisticated messages as well. Those knowledgeable in HTML can paste into the editor to build even more sophisticated messages
- Members can opt-out of receiving e-mails by following a link at the bottom of the e-mail they received

We need to encourage all members to update their member profile! There are thousands of members who have no e-mail address in their profile and many thousand more with out-of-date e-mail addresses.

Your job as a PCA member is to visit www.pca.org, log in, and review your e-mail address in the blue box on the right side. Get your e-mail addresses up-to-date with PCA so our region officials can utilize the new Emailer. While this does not replace our own ClubTalk and TechTalk listservs, there are many members who are not subscribed and perhaps wish not to be since our listservs are interactive (the PCA Emailer is an 'announce only' format and does not accept replies). So, we encourage everyone to log into their profile on PCA.org and fill in an email address which you want to use. Because PCA has not used these email addresses in the past, there has been no reason for members to maintain their profile - thus there are thousands of invalid email addresses. All you have to do to update your profile is log-in to PCA.org (if you have forgotten your log-in information, click on the "Forgot your password" link as well as read "Read this!"). You will see a blue box on the right side of your logged-in home page with the important fields of your profile. Clicking on any one of them brings up your profile page. Make changes as appropriate.

Be sure you click on the "submit" button at the top or bottom of the page to save your changes.

We're very excited about this new capability and how it will allow us to keep members informed of what is happening within PCA and Nord Stern.
