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

So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??!

A brief synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

Autocross: A low-speed driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

ClubTalk: E-mail listservs for member subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions as well as a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Get last minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. See Nord Stern's website for directions on how to subscribe.

Concours: A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity.

Driver Training: A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skill and technique on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions. A Pre-Requisite for Driver Ed participation and NOT to be confused with Driver Education events. Driver Training includes both Novice and Intermediate level options. Check with DT Chair for additional options.

Driver Education: High speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd, Blackhawk Farms, Road America for example) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Prior Driver Training participation is required. Performance enhancements are frequently made (but not required!).

Parade Laps: Held during lunch at Driver Training events at closed-course racetracks, this controlled environment with a pace car provides participants an opportunity to take street cars on the track at highway speeds so that they can see what the course is like. Minors are permitted in state approved restraints and with a signed parental release. **Time Trials:** On course timed lap with controlled starts and exiting.

PCA Club Racing: Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle required.

Rally: An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

Social: Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat and drink beverages! See our motto on pg. 3!

Taste of the Track: For those who would like to learn more about Drivers Education, but do not want to be a full driving participant in their own Porsche. You will be a passenger with an approved instructor for one run group session at track speed.

Tech Session: Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/mechanical knowledge!

Change, change, change. Changes can be good, they can be different, they can just be that: changes. I used to dread change, avoid changes and in general not be too happy knowing something was going to change. Definitely just a general fear of the unknown.

However, with age comes a bit more perspective, a bit more experience and more than a bit of personal growth so I now find myself actually seeking out change, embracing change and anticipating change with more than a bit of thrill looking forward perhaps to learning something new, experiencing something fun, different, wild, crazy, exhilerating and in general, something positive. I am sure many can relate to those feelings.

So why do I mention change? What will be happening this year is the move to a QUARTERLY printed and mailed version STARTING with March 2011. However, each month there will be an online issue and we will announce it via the PCA email blasts. So make sure PCA has an updated e-mail address for you or plan on checking the website regularly (you should be anyway, as events and info are posted there with details, contacts and phone numbers!). So Change is in the air..

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A Challenge: Who Do You Know Who Wants To Try Driver Training?

Calling all Nord Stern track enthusiasts . . . we need your help! You may not realize Nord Stern has experienced declining participation at Driver Training and Driver Education events over the past couple of years. We need your assistance as ambassadors to help reverse this trend.

The reasons for the trend are varied and are somewhat cyclical. Families are changing and some cannot devote as much time to track events. Some club members have relocated. Others are focusing on Club Racing. Whatever the reason, we need, as a club, to ensure we have a pipeline in place to keep a solid core of new drivers participating in our track events to ensue the club can continues to offer the variety and number of track events. This helps keep the track costs affordable, fills out our run-groups and allows Nord Stern to offer a full range of programming throughout the driving season.

Someone else who was already active introduced most of us to track events. While we may have had a desire to try out our sports car on a controlled high-speed venue, or have always loved road racing from afar, we may not have known how to get on the track ourselves. This is where you come into the equation! As most of us say ... Nord Stern is about the people. It's the people make this club what it is. We need to continue to attract people (new folks and those who are members of the club but have not YET tried track activities) to something that is such a vital part of Nord Stern. The driving experience encompassess not only the school, but also the social time where people connect with other Nord Sterners.

As a veteran driver, you know the ropes and can help educate the car lover about what to expect from a driving experience. You do not have to have all the answers, just steer the person in the right direction. The club can help you fill in the details. If each one of us encouraged one person to participate, we would have an abundance of participants – now that would be a great "problem" to have!

To help you spread the word and recruit new drivers, use this edition of your Nord Stern Newsletter. It has great information to share with a potential driver, or with someone who may have tried the track once before and needs a gentle nudge to come back again.

Driver Education: High-speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Must have successfully completed the Novice level of the Driver Training course.

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Nord Stern - Your Access to Track Events With Your High Performance Car

To get the most enjoyment out of owning a Porsche or **L** other high performance car, consider participating in the Nord Stern Driver Education Events taking place at Brainerd International Raceway, Road America, and other nearby venues.

While the track events are sponsored by the Nord Stern Region of the Porsche Club of America, owners of a Porsche or other high performance car who are not members of Nord Stern are welcome and encouraged to participate.

Simply put, a Driver Education Event is attendance at the track with your car and being able to drive at whatever limit you might set for yourself. Our DE Events have two primary goals: to have fun, and to be safe.

The DE Events have a time-tested formula with strict behavior rules to promote the fun and the safety goals of the program. A successful DE Event is one without injury to the driver and without damage to the car.



DRIVER EDUCATION

E is a popular racetrack activity for driving enthusiasts who own a high performance car. The two-day weekend events are scheduled during the summer months to be able to enjoy your car at a different level.

DE Events for 2011 are:

• April 30/May 1 BIR (Brainerd Int'l Raceway)

• June 18/19 BIR

• July 11/12 Road America (Elkhart Lake, WI)

July 29/30/31 BIR (Club Race also)

• September 10/11 BIR

It is important to note DE is a program for driving enthusiasts of all skill levels who have been properly prepared. A prerequisite for participation in a DE Event is completion of a Nord Stern Driver Training.

DRIVER TRAINING

river Training consists of both track and classroom instruction. Personalized track sessions pair each participant, one-on-one, with a certified instructor to learn the on-track fundamentals of high speed road course driving. Braking and slalom sessions are also scheduled. Both female and male instructors participate.

Classroom instruction emphasizes cornering, passing, track and off-track protocols, the meaning of the warning flags used by corner workers, and other important practical and safety information.

DT events for 2011 are:

Friday, April 29 BIR

Friday, September 9 BIR

At all Track Events, safety is the primary concern. Both DT and DE require the use of a Snell 2000, or better, helmet, and each car must pass a technical inspection. Tech Inspection Forms are available on the Nord Stern Website as well as in this issue of Nord Stern. The inspection can be performed at any one of the several locations listed in the newsletter (also available online).

dditionally, PCA Members currently not Nord Stern members are encouraged to enhance their enjoyment of their car by joining Nord Stern (see pg. 4 for information on how to join your local region!) and participate in any of the many locally Nord Stern organized and sponsored activities. With membership you receive Nord Stern Magazine which contains event descriptions, schedules, technical articles, and a variety of other information of interest and discounts.





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Car # Assignments . . . And How To Request A Change

With the 2011 DE season fast approaching, it's time for the open registration period for drivers to request a different car number. Each year, unused numbers can be returned to the pool for re-allocation based on the policies and procedures listed below.

Please help to keep this data set up to date. If you have an existing number, please review the attached list for accuracy. If a number is assigned to you that you are no longer using, please let the Registrar know.

Procedures to obtain and maintain a car number assigned to a driver

- Drivers must have registered for a DE event in the previous 3 years. Unused numbers are released for reassignment.
- New drivers will automatically be assigned a 3-digit number when they register for their first event. This number can be exchanged for an unused number the next year following the normal allocation process.

- Active drivers (after their first year) may request a different number if it is available. Requests should be in writing and must be received prior to the deadline set by the Registrar each spring.
- Duplicate number requests will be resolved by seniority based upon the number of years each member has been in the Club.
- Drivers will be notified of their number assignment by email or phone shortly after all requests have been processed.



'Closing Speed' by Ted West, Demontreville Press, Lake Elmo, MN


B ook Review by Ron Faust

Author Ted West is truly our kind of guy. He once wrote "driving a nice vintage 911S goes a very long way

wrote "driving a nice vintage 911S goes a very long way towards explaining the meaning of life..."

His *Closing Speed* is about racers at the top of the sport at a time when road cars were about as beautiful and fast as they ever got . . . 1970. Nord Stern artist **Michael Jekot** has graced the cover with one a striking creation—two 917's and a Ferrari 512 streaking toward the reader around a banked turn. The image is also available as a poster.

Protagonist Nick is an automotive journalist who backed into the field from UC Berkeley. Author Ted West was an automotive journalist who published in *Road and Track* before even graduating from college. Fictional Nick and real Ted West were both assigned by their magazines to cover the 1970 World Manufacturers Championship in 1970. The Porsche 917 and the Ferrari 512 were battling it out with their 12-cylinder engines through Brands Hatch, Monza, Targa Floria, Spa, Nurburgring, and LeMans. If we could only download his memories from that racing pilgrimage! In retrospect,



many of us would have delayed our careers for this tour. Traveling with the racers, Nick is forced to see Europe from historic towns and pictures que lodging spots along the way.

C h a r a c t e r development is the author's focus. Of course there are the drivers. Their egos, skills, focus and interrelations alone are enough for a book. Then there are the women that follow the circuit,

along with reporters, photographers and German and Italian team managers. The names are changed to protect the innocent. (editor's note: big grin)

Although details on the cars are sketchy, an occasional description (like this one from a Targa Florio practice day) is sensual enough to keep you reading:

"Caltavuturo, Sicily

They heard it coming . . .

Nothing . . .

Down the deep gash in the mountains leading twenty miles away to the sea . . . it was there . . .

A tiny glint across a low ridge—streaking behind a cliff. Silence.

Screeeeeaaaw!

In the valley miles below, the streaking, blaring point of light raged nearer. Its report arrived with authority now--engine full-on. Full-off. Violent blasts caromed off the mountains . . .

It moved with homicidal insistence. (editor's note: gotta love that phrase! Yikes.)

It raged into view then a kilometer below . . . Roaring. Tail slewing. It skittered sideways across the pavement, menace filling the air. Each volley repeated around the mountains three times like a cannon fire.

It was red.

A red Ferrari 512S Spider."

Somehow Nick is always in the right place on these long tracks to describe the track action in split-second detail, whether a brilliant pass or a flaming crash.

The plot thickens. In the movie *LeMans* the plot is a distant background subject that weaves the cars together; in the novel *Closing Speed* the plot takes over the racing. The racing story becomes an action thriller. Weekend by weekend the relationships change. Couplings are described in biologic detail. The racing changes from road racing to stock car bump and push racing; the cars become weapons.

Although I was wishing for more about the cars and the road races of 1970, Ted probably would tell me that books with good plots sell more copies than books about 40-year old cars and races. Also, far more people like the cars that go counterclockwise around the tracks than the cars we like. We hope he'll give us more from that summer of 1970 in his second novel. *Closing Speed* is available for \$29.95 in soft cover, 335 pages, at http://www.demontrevillepress.com.



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Driver Training – It IS for you!

S o, you have a hot car and wonder what it would be like to drive it on the track, yet you have not acted upon that thought. All you have to do is register for Nord Stern's Driver Training School and you would have that mystery solved!

I remember when I attended my first School. I was a little nervous, but excited, too. I had always enjoyed speed and was looking forward to an opportunity to take my 1992 968 on the track. The day was sunny, my instructor was stellar, I learned a ton, and I had a great time. It was a spectacular experience. I have come a long way since then, and I am thankful I was encouraged to try it because I definitely caught the "track bug."

Nord Stern's Driver Training School is a car control clinic designed to teach you how to safely drive your car both on and off the track. This one-day course includes classroom and on-track sessions led by professional, experienced and nationally certified instructors. You will learn the basics of car handling, what to expect in a variety of situations on a road course, what safety precautions exist and the rules that must be followed on the racetrack as well as the physics of driving. You are paired with your own driving instructor to ensure personalized, one-on-one instruction.

Upon successful completion of Driver Training, you are then eligible to participate in any of Nord Stern's Driver Education events. You may participate the same weekend as you complete your Driver Training, as well as any subsequent event weekends. After a final 'check off' ride with your instructor, you are ready for "at-speed" track sessions

with other drivers. At any time, you are welcome to request having an instructor ride along to provide guidance and suggestions on improving your technique.

The Driver Training School offers a Novice course, as well as an Intermediate Level. Many club members have taken each of these schools more than once because they find they learn new things from different instructors. Sometimes, they drive at Driver Education events between the Schools to get more practice time, and then take the School again.

The only requirement from Nord Stern is that participants take the Novice School once before participating in future Driver Education events.

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

Tires at High Speed

Originally published in the March 2010 issue of "Die Porsche Kassette", by Pedro of Pedro's Garage

Tire inflation specs are based on what the manufacturer considers "normal" driving conditions.

But, because of the cars we drive and the Club we belong to, many of us have the opportunity to go beyond "normal" driving conditions at the track during the Driver Education events organized by our PCA and other auto clubs in the area.

Let's try to put it in perspective.

Even though we tend to think that properly inflated tires are perfectly round, they truly aren't.

Because of the weight they carry (vehicle, fluids and passenger(s)), the bottom half of the tire's sidewalls bulge and the tread flattens where it contacts the road.

But on the top half of the tire, the sidewalls straighten out and the tread curves back into its molded round shape. This difference in shape between the top and bottom halves of a tire is known as "deflection".

This deflection will occur with every revolution of the tire, so picture this:

A 225/45/ZR17 tire could be considered a standard front tire in a Boxster, Cayman or Carrera. This particular tire has a 25 inch overall diameter and after doing the math we know that this tire will turn approximately 807 times every mile. At 25 miles per hour this tire will roll 5.6 times per second, at 70 mph (speed limit on the Interstate) it will roll15.7 times per second and at 140 mph (speed right before braking for turn 17 at Sebring) the tire will roll a daunting 31.4 times every second. This means that the tire is changing its shape from its unloaded to its loaded state and back every 3/100th of a second.



This constant tire deflection plus the friction of the tire against the road (track) generates tremendous heat build-up in the tires. Since the tires are filled with air (or nitrogen) which is a gas, Boyles Law demonstrates that if the volume of gas is maintained constant, its pressure is directly proportional to its temperature, therefore your tire pressure will go up as the tire gets used, and the faster the tires spin, the faster the temperature and therefore the pressure will build up.

The rule of thumb is that the tire's pressure will increase by 1 psi for every 10° Fahrenheit increase in temperature, or 1 psi for every 4 minutes of use during the first 20 minutes of operation.

All of the above to basically say that the faster you go, the higher your tire pressure will be.

So, when we're at the track or Auto Cross we must keep in mind that we will have a tire pressure increase as soon as the tires start to heat up. This will alter our car's handling, so we need to carefully monitor the pressure throughout the different sessions during the day.

But how do we know what the ideal pressure is?

We should generally start with the recommended pressures from the car's manufacturer. Then, the tires will tell us if they need more or less pressure.



Most modern high-speed rated tires have special markers to show us the optimal tire patch.

This triangle tells us where the edge of the optimal tread wear should be.

As you can see above, the wear is a little short of the marker, meaning that we have too much pressure.



Dropping a couple of pounds of pressure and then hitting



the track again gives us the optimal patch, as seen below where the edge of the wear is right to the tip of the marker. Also, always keep in mind that you should never inflate beyond the tire's maximum pressure, stamped on its sidewall.



Keep an eye on your tire's pressures and ...



So, What Did You Get for Christmas?

Editor's note: thought this was a fun exchange on clubtalk and I share it here with all . . . not sure if Nick ever got his actual 'question' answered!

Susan got me a Cayenne S for X-mas. Actually, we were going to look at the MDX, X5 and the Q5, but drove the new Cayenne for a lark. Who would spend all that money on a Porsche SUV? Save it for a down payment on a GT3! Well, we drove the Cayenne and didn't even bother to drive the X5. The new Cayenne is an unbelievable vehicle; much better than our 335 when you consider the utility. I might never buy a "sports sedan" again and we really tend to favor smaller cars. Porsche has really improved the Cayenne over the first generation.

I used to laugh at all those rich Wayzata-ites who would buy a Cayenne and then trade it in because it doesn't "drive like their Lexus." Not anymore!

OK, so here is a question about the Tire Monitoring System on newer Porsches. The owner's manual tells you to fill the tires to a certain psi - depending on tire type and wheel size - at 680 F. Let's call that the factory setting. Well, I have always adjusted the pressure in my street cars to be at the "factory setting" but at roughly the expected ambient temperature. So if I expect lows to be in the 10-20's I'd generally add 5-6 psi to keep it at the "factory setting." But the TMS on the Cayenne then tells you are +5 psi too high (when the car has been sitting at 200 or so). This seems to imply you are supposed to run in the winter on lower tire pressures than during the summer. I don't understand why this would be true. Stiffer sidewalls? Can't be. Does the operating temp of tires on street cars hit roughly the same temp in winter and summer? That doesn't seem to be the case. Anyone have any thoughts on what you are supposed to do in MN winters?
