So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??!

A brief synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest?!!!

Autocross: A low-speed driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

ClubTalk: E-mail listservs for member subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions as well as a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Get last minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. See Nord Stern's website for directions on how to subscribe.

Concours: A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity.

Driver Training: A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skill and technique on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions. A Pre-Requisite for Driver Ed participation and NOT to be confused with Driver Education events. Driver Training includes both Novice and Intermediate level options. Check with DT Chair for additional options.

Driver Education: High speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd, Blackhawk Farms, Road America for example) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Prior Driver Training participation is required. Performance enhancements are frequently made (but not required!).

Parade Laps: Held during lunch at Driver Training events at closed-course racetracks, this controlled environment with a pace car provides participants an opportunity to take street cars on the track at highway speeds so that they can see what the course is like. Minors are permitted in state approved restraints and with a signed parental release. **Time Trials:** On course timed lap with controlled starts and exiting.

PCA Club Racing: Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle required.

Rally: An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

Social: Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat and drink beverages! See our motto on pg. 3!

Taste of the Track: For those who would like to learn more about Drivers Education, but do not want to be a full driving participant in their own Porsche. You will be a passenger with an approved instructor for one run group session at track speed.

Tech Session: Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/ mechanical knowledge!

Paul Russell and Co. - Restoration Experts

In late 1975, my latest assignment with NWA took me to Boston where I took up residence in the town of Marblehead, Massachusetts. In the Spring of 76, I was puttering around town and came upon an establishment called Dearborn Automobile Company housed in a quaint looking, stone-faced building. I stopped to have a look and found numerous Mercedes 300SL Gullwing automobiles in various stages of repair and restoration. I asked a cordial young gentleman (who turned out to be Paul Russell)



if they did any work on Porsches and his immediate reply was, "You've got to talk to Alex, he's the Porsche guy." Alex Finigan wasn't there at the time but it wasn't long before I found him, or more correctly he found

me, and followed me home when he spotted me driving my Speedster. This was the start of a friendship that has remained until this day.

In 1978, Paul and Alex purchased the mechanical side of Dearborn and the entire business moved to Topsfield, MA where Dearborn sold cars and Alex and Paul handled the mechanical work. Their excellent quality of work and reputation rapidly spread and five years later, they split from Dearborn and took their operation to Essex, MA where, in a large warehouse, they established Gullwing Service Company dba Paul Russell and Company-(www. paulrussellandcompany. com). At this point they expanded their scope of work and now were able to handle every aspect of automobile restoration; body, engines, interior and anything else the customer required. Their services have branched out to other margues in

addition to Mercedes-Porsche, Ferrari, Alfa Romeo, Bugatti and others. One of their primary customers has been Ralph Lauren and they have restored a Porsche 959 and RSK for him along with numerous other cars, some which have won best-in-show at Pebble Beach. (Interesting story on the 959- The reason it was in their shop was that during the "Federalization "of the car the inspectors flipped the car causing extensive damage - \$220K of parts needed from Stuttgart). They have customers from all over

the globe.

Just what do all the intitials in Porsche's Corporate Names Mean Anyway?

While writing a story about the the 80th anniversary of Porsche Engineering I got to wondering about the alphabet soup that makes up all the various Porsche corporate entities (we all know that Porsche Acronyms are used readily in their marketing). I'm sure, that for a German business person it's probably second nature and they don't even give them a second thought (similar to how we might see "LLC" or "Inc" following a company here in the US). However, as someone not familiar with all the various acronyms and abbreviations used in the German business world I decided to look it up and take a stab at identifying everything. Some of the abbreviations are quite obvious; others, not so much. Okay, I admit, the subject matter is a little dry, but it's something I've been wondering about for a long time. Perhaps you were too.

Let's start at the beginning

Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche Gesellschaft mit beschränkter Haftung, Konstruktion und Beratung für Motoren- und Fahrzeugbau. Yup, it's a mouthful and the full name of the company founded by Ferdinand Porsche on April 25th 1931. This company, let's call it "Porsche Engineering" for short, is what eventually morphed into what we know today as Dr. Ing.

h.c. F. Porsche AG; or, if you want to make it easy on yourself, simply shorten that lengthy moniker to Porsche AG. Porsche AG is the main subsidiary of Porsche Automobil Holding SE (otherwise known as Porsche SE). Confused? Don't worry, so is everyone else and we haven't even brought VW into the picture yet. At some point in the future we'll put together a post trying to explain the capital holding structure of Porsche (for those of you

interested) but first I need to figure it out myself. For now, if you really want to make your head spin, take a look at this document. In the meantime, we'll work on explaining all the acronyms for you below.

Back to the Alphabet Soup

- Let's see, we have:
- § Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche
- § Gesellschaft mit beschränkter Haftung (GmbH)
- § Porsche AG
- § Porsche SE

1. If there is an obvious one, I guess it's the first. "Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche" stands for "Doktor Ingenieur honoris causa Ferdinand Porsche." If we take each piece it's a bit easier to put

> it together. "Dr. Ing." is an acronym for "Doktor Ingenieur" or what we know as a "Doctor of Engineering" (in other words, the equivalent of a Ph.D.). And "honoris causa" simply means an "honorary degree" (Porsche was awarded his in 1917 by the Vienna University of Technology).

2. "Gesellschaft mit beschränkter Haftung," or "GmbH" for short, translates directly as a "Company (Gesellschaft) with (mit) Limited

(beschränkter) Liability (Haftung)." We would know it as a "Limited Liability Company" or "LLC" here in the States.

3. With regard to "Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG," we've already explained the beginning and "Porsche" is self-explanatory so let's look at the "AG". In 1972 Porsche went public and in

1973 "Porsche AG" was officially entered into the commercial register. "AG" is short for "Aktiengesellschaft" which is a German compound noun that literally translates to shares (Aktien) company (gesellschaft). In other words, it is a company limited by shares or owned by the shareholders.

Last, but definitely not least, is "Porsche Automobil Holding SE." In this instance, the "SE" is an acronym for the Latin term "Societas Europaea" which translates directly to "European Company." An "SE" is a form of European Public Company governed by the rules of the Council Regulation on the Statute for a European Company of the European Union. That's it. You now know more about German business acronyms than you probably ever wanted to. However, you never know, this could very well be a trivia question in an upcoming Porsche related competition that just might win you a nice prize. Not to mention, if we ever do decipher Porsche's complex corporate holding structure it will help in understanding how and why it is set up the way it is.
