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

So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??!

A brief synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

Autocross: A low-speed driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

ClubTalk: E-mail listservs for member subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions as well as a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Get last minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. See Nord Stern's website for directions on how to subscribe.

Concours: A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity. Note: Nord Stern conducts an All Porsche Show at which cars are 'shown' but not judged.

Driver Training: A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skill and technique on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions. A Pre-Requisite for Driver Ed participation and NOT to be confused with Driver Education events. Driver Training includes both Novice and Intermediate level options. Check with DT Chair for additional options.

Driver Education: High speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd, Blackhawk Farms, Road America for example) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Prior Driver Training participation is required. Performance enhancements are frequently made (but not required!).


Parade Laps: Held during lunch at Driver Training events at closed-course racetracks, this controlled environment with a pace car provides participants an opportunity to take street cars on the track at highway speeds so that they can see what the course is like. Minors are permitted in state approved restraints and with a signed parental release. **Time Trials:** On course timed lap with controlled starts and exiting.

PCA Club Racing: Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle required.

Rally: An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

Social: Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat and drink beverages! See our motto on pg. 3!

Tech Session: Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/mechanical knowledge!

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Car # Assignments . . . And How To Request A Change

by Dave Anderson, Registrar

The 2013 DE track season is fast approaching and it's time to open the car number registration period. Car numbers are used at our Brainerd (BIR) and Road America (RA) track events to help with identification. As your Registrar, I make every attempt to ensure that event car numbers are unique within the Run Group sessions; including those 2nd day late afternoon sessions when we combine groups. You can help by ensuring that you get a number assigned to your car. As long as you participate in at least one track event within a moving 3-year period of time your assigned number will be yours to use.

This year I scrubbed the car number database with a hard preference to active Nord Stern members. Any number assignment with a usage conflict was given to the Nord Stern member that has participated in a track event within the last four years. I did this with an extra year of grace with the idea that I'll make the 3-year participation requirement a hard cut-off next year. Additional conflicts were given precedence to prior participants from other clubs based on the number of active years with Nord Stern and, finally, to our guests. This means that some of the car numbers used in prior years may not actually be assigned to you. That's

okay for the individual events where I'll make ad hoc number assignments based on ease of applying numbers with painters tape, but I'll always give priority to registered Nord Stern members when a registration conflict arises.

Please help to keep the car number assignments up to date by reviewing the published list. If you have an existing number that isn't assigned to you, but you've used it at a track event in the past 4 years, let me know. On the other hand, if you see your name associated with a car number you're no longer using, let me know that as well.

You'll note that a lot of numbers that have previously been assigned have now been released back to the allocation pool. If you'd like to change your assigned car number, all that is needed is to contact the Registrar by e-mail or give me a call at the information listed in the form below. To make the assignment process as efficient as possible, all I need is your current number and three new numbers in preference order. I'll reassign the first one on your list that is available. Conflicting change requests will be given priority based on when I receive the change request.

- Driver's License
- Appropriate clothing: pants, socks, closed toe shoes, qualified helmet



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Stonehenge is located in central England, seemingly in the middle of nowhere. Carhenge is located in northwest Nebraska, truly in the middle of nowhere.

Stonehenge is a circular grouping of stones. Carhenge is a circular grouping of old cars painted grey.

We have a reasonably good idea of who built Stonehenge and when, but we can only guess at why they built it. We know exactly who built Carhenge and when, but we can only guess why, even though they have given us an explanation.

About Stonehenge, Wikipedia says:

"Archeologists believe the iconic stone monument was constructed anywhere from 3000 BC to 2000 BC. Archeological evidence...indicates that Stonehenge could possibly have served as a burial ground from its earliest beginnings. The dating of cremated remains found on the site indicate that deposits contain human bone material from as early as 3000 BC, when the initial ditch and bank were first dug. Such deposits continued at Stonehenge for at least another 500 years."



According to Carhenge.com:

"The artist of this unique car sculpture, Jim Reinders, experimented with unusual and interesting artistic creations throughout his life. While living in England, he had the opportunity to study the design and purpose of Stonehenge. Carhenge was built as a memorial to Reinders' father who once lived on the farm where Carhenge now stands. While relatives were gathered following the death of Reinders' father in 1982, the discussion turned to a memorial and the idea of a Stonehenge replica was developed. The family agreed to gather in five years and build it. The clan, about 35 strong, gathered in June 1987 and went to work. They held the dedication on the Summer Solstice in 1987, with champagne, poetry, songs and a play written by the family."

I have now been to both and, though we know less about it, Stonehenge makes much more sense. Looking at it, you know that there was a reason for it, even if you're not sure what it was.



Looking at, and standing in, Carhenge you have your doubts as to there being any good reason for it. In fact, the lack of any good reason for Carhenge is a large part of the fun of visiting it. Somebody just built it because it seemed like a good idea. People just go there because it seems like a good idea. Both are right.

Carhenge is a replica, more or less, of Stonehenge. It was built using a variety of derelict cars from the 50's and 60's, although I thought I spotted a Chevy Vega in the mix. There appears to have been no particular reason for choosing the cars used in the structure (other than that were available) or for their particular placement in it. If you studied it long enough, you might see a pattern but, really, it is best not to over think this thing.

The Stonehenge replica is surrounded by a number of other sculptures, some involving old cars, others not. None adds anything to the site, although I did like a work entitled "Ford Seasons" (with apologies to Antonio Vivaldi). It is four Fords stuck nose down into the ground, each painted one of the seasonal colors of the surrounding winter wheat fields.

As you would expect for something in the middle of nowhere, Carhenge is not conveniently located on the way to anywhere, unless you're headed for Alliance Nebraska. It's probably not















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a true bucket list destination, but it would be worth the two or three hours it would add to a leisurely trip out west. It could also make a nice day trip from the

Badlands or Custer Sate Park. There is no best way to get there, but I-90 to US 83 in central South Dakota, and then south to Nebraska 20 is as good as any.

I'll never do my Panamera's 170 mph top speed, nor test the all-wheel drive in our Minnesota winters. But boy, will I show off come spring!

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





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Book Reviews for Porschephiles . . . Rockin' Garages


Rockin' Garages sounds like a story from Southern California earthquake country. Actually, it's more about raising the roof than shaking the ground. This book deals with the garages, the cars and car activities of some of the rock and roll music world's big names.

It turns out, guys like Billy Joel, Keith Urban, Nick Mason, Kenny Wayne Shepard, etc. are into cars as well as music. Even Arlo Guthrie (of Alice's Restaurant Massacree fame) is included for us old-fogie Folk Music types. If you don't recognize the garage owner's names, you might recognize the bands represented - Fabulous Thunderbirds, AC/DC, Aerosmith, Fleetwood Mac, Doobie Brothers, etc. It is not clear how many of these musicians/ bands started in garages, but this book does make it clear that some have graduated from the big stage, back into garages, now devoting their time playing with 4-wheeled instruments. Half way through the first paragraph of the Foreword (by Billy F Gibbons of ZZ Top), you'll know that this ain't like no other car book you ever read, no how. The four chapters - The Need for Speed, Rockin' Racers, Fuel Injected and Collectors and Cruisers - segregate (pardon the expression) the 20 musicians (they aren't all Rock Stars) profiled, into categories based on their automotive inclinations.

If you are surprised to find that many rock & roll musicians are gearheads, read the introduction dealing with an interview with Dr. Martin Jack Rosenblum, Professor of Music History and Literature, University of Wisconsin. He thinks it is a natural combination. There is a preponderance of Detroit Iron in the fleets of these musicians, but there is Porsche content – the index lists 14 different Porsche models, some appearing multiple times. Though the Rock and Roll performers are the vehicle for this book, it's all about the cars and there are some very interesting cars described. The range of tastes is extraordinary and the cars are meticulously

prepared. The two common threads are More Power, and a familiar one - Cars are meant to be driven, several on the track.

Some of these guys are really serious – several have opened restoration shops and others have raced at dirt ovals and such places as LeMans and the Daytona 24 hour. It seem that the racers compare the feelings of starting a race to those of stepping on stage to start a concert. One is renowned as a rebuilder of 12 cyl Ferrari



engines. Another vintage races a Maserati 250F (the model Stirling Moss drove in so many Formula 1 races), and lets his wife drive his 250 GTO Ferrari, on the street. With their collections and customizations, these guys are living the boyhood dreams of many of us. Interestingly, a recurring theme amongst these famous musicians is how they started playing to get money to buy a car, often their first car.


Rockin' Garages is an easy, very interesting read, but there are a few jarring notes – extensive picture captions and section teazers abound, and are just quoted from the text, so as you read, it seems that the text repeats itself, as do pictures from the teazers. Also, some notes that the editors wrote to themselves still remain in the text. Sloppy editing perhaps, but the unique content still makes this book well worth reading. As exemplified by the cover, this book not only contains lots of color pictures, but uses color extensively in the layout design.

With 192 9-3/4 x 11-1/4 inch pages and 220 illustrations, this book is almost coffee table size. With its extensive (flamboyant?) use of color, it can be the color accent for any room after you have digested the captivating stories inside. *Rockin' Garages* should be available for \$35 at your favorite book seller, Ask for it, or at www.motorbooks.com.







registration. Remember to review the PCRs, available on both www.pca.org and http://parade2103.pca.org

Q: How much does it cost?

A: Everyone signing up for Parade must pay an entrant fee of \$159, which covers the entrant and co-entrant.

Fees for the four major competitive events are:

- Concours -- \$30 per car,
- Autocross -- \$30 per driver,
- TSD Rally -- \$15 per car, and
- Tech/Historical Quiz -- \$15 per person.
- Entrant fees for guests are as follows:
- JPP/CAFP -- \$20,
- Child age 13-15 -- \$15,
- Child under age 13 -- \$10.
- Adult guests -- \$30.
- Additional fees apply for banquet/meal tickets for selected other activities, such as the tours, golf outing etc.

Q: What is a co-entrant?

A: Entrants and co-entrants must be PCA members, but they need not be family or affiliate members. This means that entrants and co-entrants must have their own membership numbers. Check your profile online or with your local membership chair if you are not sure if you have a family/affiliate member. As an example, if you have not signed your wife up as your family member with PCA she is not an actual member of PCA and cannot be signed up as your co-entrant until she is. If you have your son/daughter/friend as your co-member your spouse is not a member. You can change your family member/affiliate member by contacting National at admin@pca.org or 410.381.0911

Q: Can I take other people that are not members?

A:Yes. There are additional fees for this and restrictions. Other guests are welcome; however, only the entrant, co-entrant, and JPP/CAFP entrants may enter the competitive events (exception: children ages 13-15 may register for the Technical/Historical Quiz). If other guests are PCA members, they must submit their own registration and pay their own registration fee to enter the competitive events.

Q: What about my children?

A: Bring them! Parade is a family event and there are activities for all ages, both individually and as a family.

Q: Can older children participate in the competitive events?

A: Yes. Junior Participant Program (JPP) entrants are children, grandchildren, nieces, and nephews of PCA members who are 16 or 17 years old. College-Aged Family Program (CAFP) entrants are children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews of PCA members who are 18-25 years old. JPP and CAFP entrants are required to drive the same vehicle and in the same respective men's and ladies classes as the PCA member hosting them.

Q: What about my car? Does it have to be a Porsche?

A: Automobile eligibility for the Autocross, Concours and TSD Rally is outlined in the Parade Competition Rules (PCRs). An entrant and/or co-entrant may enter up to two automobiles (thus separate cars for the concours, rally, and autocross), and only Porsches as defined in the PCRs may be registered. Entrants may participate in the TSD Rally in any Porsche that is registered for Parade (assuming it is currently registered for street-use). For the autocross, there is a limit of two drivers per automobile (unless JPP or CAFP of which the limit is four in any combination amongst both automobiles).

Entrants may participate in other events (such as tours or gimmick rally) in any automobile, even if it is not a Porsche.

Q: What if I am not sure if I am coming. Do I have to preregister?

A: Yes. Advance Registration is mandatory -- there is no onsite registration during Parade. Parade registrations are not transferable.

O: What if I cannot come for the whole week?

A: Registration does not require that you stay for the entire week. But, staying for the entire week is the best way to get the complete Parade experience.

Q: What if I register and then cannot come?

A: Fifty percent of your registration fee and 100 percent of your banquet fees will be refunded if your e-mailed cancellation request is received on or before June 15. There is no refund for cancellations made after that time. You may make changes to your registration at any time before June 15.

Q: When should I plan to arrive?

A: Parade entrants should check in for Parade on Sunday, June 23 between 9am and 5pm. This is the only time when all the event chair-people will be all together in one place to check you in, answer all your questions, and make sure you have the banquet seats you want, pick up your meal tickets and are classified properly for the competitive events you've entered. And...that's when you get your Parade goodie-bags and volunteer t-shirts. Of course it's also a great time to run into old friends from previous Parades and start building new friendships for the week's great events! Though late check-in is available the following couple of days, some events require you be properly checked in well in advance of the event start. See the Parade Competition Rules at www.pca.org for details.

Q: Can I come if I don't register?

A: Only registered attendees may participate in Parade activities. Events that are in public areas (i.e. Concours) are open for viewing only, to non attendees. Additionally, access to the Parade Goodie Store is available with your PCA membership card.

Q: Where is the Concours d' Elegance being held?

A: The Concours d' Elegance is being held on the golf course at the resort just steps from the hotel.

Q: I have heard that the Concours d'Elegance is only for





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those that don't drive their car (much) and use Q-tips to clean it. Is that true?

A: No. The Concours has many entry classes for all levels of interest from the "new" enthusiast to those some would deem fanatics. Think of it as "If you got it, flaunt it" to the people who share your passion and appreciation for your car.

With that in mind, new this year, we are introducing a Concours "Street" Class; a new Concours entry level class. In the new Street Class, only the exterior, including wheels and tires, and interior will be judged. Still not sure what to do? You can attend Concours 101- These are one hour technical sessions primarily for new or aspiring Concours entrants. Sessions will be scheduled both before and after the Concours event. We will discuss how to prepare for Concours judging, what the judges are looking for and how to interpret scores and comments.

- Saturday, June 22 5-6 pm: in the Concours Prep Area
- Friday, June 28: as part of Tech Academy

Q: Where is the Autocross being held?

A: On Wednesday and Thursday June 26th and 27th, the always exciting Autocross will be held on the Antrim County airport runway. Forget everything you've experienced the last couple of years at the Parade Autocross, because it's about the change. (Have I got your attention now?) We've been working hard over the last few years to improve the Parade autocross experience by offering things like: more runs, rookie schools, chalk talks, staying on schedule, etc..

But one thing has been lacking and that one big thing has been the size of the autocross lot. For 2013, that will not be an issue. The parade autocross will take place at a community airport that offers us plenty of open asphalt since they're planning to close the runway to aviation traffic during our event. And to make it even more exciting, the airport was recently renovated so all the runway and taxiways are newly repaved with highgrip, aviation-grade asphalt. The new surface is billiard table smooth and perfectly uniform from start to finish.

Over the last few years due to size limitations, the course designs were like building a "ship in a bottle", however this year will feature an open, faster design that will cover tons of real estate. Can you say 3rd gear? I know I can! If this sounds interesting to you, please come join us.

The two day format once again allows us to accommodate all drivers who wish to participate.

The Autocross Chalk-talk will be held Monday, June 24 in Mackinac B&C

The airport location is about 20-30 minutes from the resort. Shuttle service will be provided throughout the two-day event leaving from the resort. Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate non-Parade entrants as spectators to this event.




