## So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??!

A brief synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

Volunteering: The club runs on volunteers! A great way to meet members and get the most out of your membership. Our club exists BECAUSE of members volunteering their time and talents to plan and execute our many different events. With NO paid staff, we depend entirely on volunteers to run OUR club and keep the calendar full of interesting and well planned activities. Whether your interest lies in track events, social activities, technology, touring, tech sessions, car shows or other, we have a place for you and many an opportunity to get involved.

**AUTOCROSS:** A low-speed driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

**CLUBTALK:** E-mail listserv for member (Nord Stern) subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions as well as a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Also for last minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. Subscribe at http://listserv.nordstern.org/mailman/listinfo/clubtalk, or any account edits, updates.

**CONCOURS:** A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity. Note: NS conducts an 'All Porsche Show' at which cars are 'shown' but not judged.

**DRIVER TRAINING:** A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skills and techniques on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions. A Pre-Requisite for Driver Ed participation and NOT to be confused with Driver Education events. Driver Training includes both Novice and Intermediate level options. Check with DT Chair for additional options.

**DRIVER EDUCATION:** High-speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd, Blackhawk Farms, Road America, for example) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Prior Driver Training participation, or the equivalent is required. Performance enhancements are frequently made (but not required!).

**PARADE LAPS:** Sometimes held during lunch at Driver Training/Driver Ed events at closed-course racetracks, this controlled environment, with a pace car, provides participants an opportunity to take street cars on the track at highway speeds to see what the course is like. Minors are permitted in state approved restraints and with a signed parental release.

**PCA CLUB RACING:** Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle are required.

**RALLY:** An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

**SOCIAL / MEMBERSHIP:** Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat, and drink beverages!

**TECH SESSION:** Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/mechanical knowledge!



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cently, while scrolling through Nord Stern's Facebook page, a particular post caught my eye and I could NOT resist reaching out to this particular Nord Stern FB member. There, in his sweaty attire was the late Nord Stern member/club racer, Clint Sawinski. Clint passed away several years ago at far too young an age.

There are many club members who remember Clint, his various track cars, his enthusiasm for racing and his graciousness in sharing his skills. The Boeders have a lot of Clint stories and I am so pleased to connect with Clint's son, Jake, the FB member who posted the photos that caught my attention. Jake has been kind enough to share a number of his father/son memories and the connection they shared with Porsche. Please enjoy, as both Bruce and I did; our memories and connections are so important!

rowing up, I had the opportunity to spend many weekends with my dad heading to different tracks.

And when I eventually got my driver's permit, I became his "co-driver" for various cross-country trips trailering the race car to Road America, Mid-Ohio, Putnam Park, and of course, BIR, among others.

We would load up the car and all the gear on the Thursday night after his work and my school and as soon as we got home from work/school on those Fridays, we would hit the road - headed to whatever race was on the schedule. For the longer drives such as Mid-America I would take over



driving our trusty tow vehicle, a Jeep Cherokee (Classic), in the middle of the night. He would get as much sleep as he could while I was driving, and we would pretty much arrive at the track just in time for him to throw on his race suit and get on track for first practice. That trailer was badly undersized, so we were always blowing tires and leaf springs on it.

And I did get to participate in 2 or 3 Driver Ed weekends at BIR around 2010 in my dad's track 993 (the silver car #95).

For the Brown 1977 911 coupe (photos above and below), he would always tell me when I was a kid "someday that will be your car." When you're a kid growing up you just pass those comments off. "Ok, sure, Dad. Whatever you say" is all I would think in those moments. When my dad's good friend "delivered" the car in the weeks after his passing, that's when the reality of his loss started to set in.

My dad had bought the 911 while he was living in Germany for a year or two, and when he moved back to the States, he imported it to bring it home with him. He was the 2nd owner and now I am the third. I remember my sister and I getting sick in the back seat of it when we were toddlers!

I know I am very, very fortunate to have this Porsche, and to be honest I need to remind myself of that from time to time. There's not a day that goes by that I wish I didn't have this car and had a healthy father. So, it's really a generational car for me. My aspirations with it are to get it 'healthy' and back on the road and keep it on the road. Some day (hopefully a LONG time from now), it will be my son's car. And when that day comes, I'd want to have it as a well sorted, vintage,



air-cooled, analog machine that won't be forgotten - or left in a field somewhere!

I've had the car about 4 years now (yikes, it's been that long already). And just this summer I finally got a bit more serious about working on it. I got it running by flushing out the old gas, an oil change, and tuning the CIS injection system. Frankly, it would always start and run - but pretty rough. The shifting felt just terrible, and I just thought that's how an old car should feel. But I finally looked into it and discovered that the bushing in the shift linkage was completely gone. So, I replaced that and the other two shifter bushings.



Right now I am working on rebuilding the brakes. All but one caliper was completely stuck. The plan for this upcoming winter after the brakes, are the suspension bushings and oil leaks. The rear main seal leaks badly and the few times I've driven the car

around the block it smoked pretty bad from the oil leaking right onto the exhaust. Valve cover gaskets and oil return tubes are also on the list. If I get those things taken are of this winter that should get the car back on the road for next summer. From there I can drive it for a summer and then put together another winter "to do" list.

No matter what happens with the car I'll always have a time capsule. And a great reminder of my dad and



all those race weekends adventures.



#### From racing to series production

In 1974 the turbocharger technology recently developed for the 917/10 and 917/30 racing cars finds its way into the Porsche 911.

When the series version of the Porsche 911 Turbo celebrates its début at the Paris Motor Show in autumn 1974, it heralds a new age in many ways, and represents a first. Porsche has taken the winning turbocharger technology featured in the 917/10 and 917/30 Can-Am race cars and implanted it into a series vehicle, completely eclipsing the car's previous performance. When combined with the 911 Carrera RS 1973, which is fitted with a naturally aspirated engine, it delivers 210 PS, though with the 911 Turbo it delivers 50 PS more; with 343 Nm of torque, it outperforms the previous top model in the 911 series by a solid 88 Nm. The 911 Turbo is seriously fast, achieving speeds in excess of 250 km/h and reaching 100 km/h from a standing start in just 5.5 seconds. In short, its performance sets new benchmarks and hits new heights for drivers.

Hans Mezger, engineer and "father" of the Porsche turbo engine, captures the essence of the first 911 Turbo in a few words: "It's still all about driving – where other engines hit their limits, the turbo engine is just getting started. So driving is even more thrilling." In fact, the 911 Turbo takes driving pleasure and dynamics to new heights – by no means is it a simple sporty enhancement for anyone and everyone. Though the three-cylinder boxer – which is fitted with mono-turbocharger, wastegate and Bosch K Jetronic fuel injector – proves its mettle as a sophisticated Porsche engine even at idling speed, when it hits 4,000 revs on the central counter it really creates new challenges for the driver. If the 911 Turbo comes up in conversation today, people still excitedly remember the "shock to the system" that many drivers experienced, overwhelmed by its powerful acceleration that caused the track-wide rear axle to practically tear into the asphalt. Witnesses of the era certainly reported the odd rear-end collision involving a 911 Turbo; not caused by a driver absent-mindedly braking too late and driving into the next car, but rather the vehicle's powerful acceleration whilst overtaking ending with some accidental contact.

## By a distance – much faster than anyone else Hans Mezger – The Porsche 917 Chief Engineer

In 1968, Chief Engineer Hans Mezger and his colleagues develop the 917 in record time. The car is a highlight of his career.

Hans Mezger is born on 18 November 1929 in Ottmarsheim, Swabia. After graduating from high school and completing his studies in mechanical engineering at the University of Stuttgart, Hans Mezger joins the technical calculation department at Porsche in 1956. He is initially involved in the development of the Carrera four-cylinder engine and develops his own formula to calculate cam shapes; his formula makes the cam manufacturing process much simpler and brings huge cost savings. At the start of the 1960s, Hans Mezger is also involved in the development of the 1.5-litre eight-cylinder engine and chassis for the Formula One racing car, the Porsche 804, which goes on to win the 1962 French Grand Prix with Dan Gurney at the wheel. After working on the 804, Hans Mezger constructs his first complete engine with six-cylinder boxer for the 911.

Hans Mezger is appointed head of the newly created motorsport development department under Ferdinand Piëch in 1965. Guided by his leadership the department goes on to develop outstanding race cars and racing engines that establish a reputation for Porsche as a world-renowned name in motorsport. The 12-cylinder engine of the Porsche 917 is an undeniable highlight from this period;

the new 580 PS Group 4 sports car proves its might at the 1969 24 hours of Le Mans race, leading the pack with ease until it is forced to drop out near the end. "We were, by a distance, much faster than the rest of the grid in the 917, and the engine ran like clockwork. If the gearbox hadn't cracked, it would have been an outstanding victory," continues Hans Mezger. In the subsequent year, the enhanced 917 finally gives Porsche its long-awaited first overall win at the 1970 Le Mans race.

For the 1971 Can-Am racing series, the 12-cylinder engine is fitted with completely new turbocharge technology featuring wastegates, to enable outstanding responsiveness and eventually deliver up to 1,200 PS; by 1974 the same technology has found its way into the series models, namely



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the 911 Turbo.

As well as making many other successful advances in motorsport, Hans Mezger dedicates himself to one particular customer commission in the early 1980s: he constructs the "TAG-Turbo Made by Porsche" engine for the British McLaren racing team. It is a Formula One engine that generates up to 1,000 PS output from just a 1.5-litre displacement. Between 1984 and 1986, this V6 engine dominates the elite motorsport world and wins three consecutive Formula One World Drivers' Championships.

After 37 years at Porsche, Hans Mezger retired at the end of 1993, though he remains closely affiliated with the Porsche brand and company – and is still the proud owner of a 1977 Porsche 911 Carrera 3.0. His extensive expertise is still much sought-after and valued by journalists and authors.


