So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??!

A brief synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

Volunteering: The club runs on volunteers! A great way to meet members and get the most out of your membership. Our club exists BECAUSE of members volunteering their time and talents to plan and execute our many different events. With NO paid staff, we depend entirely on volunteers to run OUR club and keep the calendar full of interesting and well planned activities. Whether your interest lies in track events, social activities, technology, touring, tech sessions, car shows or other, we have a place for you and many an opportunity to get involved.

AUTOCROSS: A low-speed driving event, teaching one how to maneuver one's car around a set course of pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is available, drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Some safety equipment needed (helmet).

CLUBTALK: E-mail listserv for member (Nord Stern) subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions as well as a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Also for last minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. Subscribe at http://listserv.nordstern.org/mailman/listinfo/clubtalk, or any account edits, updates.

CONCOURS: A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection competition. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based upon cleanliness, overall condition and authenticity. Note: NS conducts an 'All Porsche Show' at which cars are 'shown' but not judged.

DRIVER TRAINING: A driving course designed to teach and enhance high speed driving skills and techniques on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track 'exercises' plus supervised lapping sessions. A Pre-Requisite for Driver Ed participation and NOT to be confused with Driver Education events. Driver Training includes both Novice and Intermediate level options. Check with DT Chair for additional options.

DRIVER EDUCATION: High-speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd, Blackhawk Farms, Road America, for example) where drivers are grouped according to prior lap times. Prior Driver Training participation, or the equivalent is required. Performance enhancements are frequently made (but not required!).

PARADE LAPS: Sometimes held during lunch at Driver Training/Driver Ed events at closed-course racetracks, this controlled environment, with a pace car, provides participants an opportunity to take street cars on the track at highway speeds to see what the course is like. Minors are permitted in state approved restraints and with a signed parental release.

PCA CLUB RACING: Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle are required.

RALLY: An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally.

SOCIAL / MEMBERSHIP: Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat, and drink beverages!

TECH SESSION: Casual educational session that span a wide range of topics, from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements and general car/mechanical knowledge!





If you'd like to request one or change your assigned car number, all that is needed is to contact the Registrar by e-mail (Registrar@NordStern.org). To make the assignment process as efficient as possible, simply provide your current number and three new numbers in preference order. We'll reassign the first one on your list that is available. Conflicting number requests will be given priority based on the current membership status and when the change request is received.

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o I was meandering through my local Barnes & Noble. I had already cruised through the car magazines, noting once again the amazing fact that Jolly Olde, a country the size of New York State, still dominates the car mag shelf space. I counted four Porsche-only monthly Brit titles. How can that be?

No matter. On to the remainder shelves. And there, amid the 50% off titles on the top ten killer submarines of the world, how to cook a souffle like Julia Child and gardening secrets of the pros... there it was... really? Could it be? Yes indeed! "The Comedians in Cars Getting Coffee Book."

I'm a big Jerry fan. Late night, when Stephen and Jimmy and Jimmy are on hiatus, I watch Seinfeld reruns. And they hold up. The puffy shirt, the bubble boy, yada-yada-yada, the soup Nazi, Festivus. They're timeless. Not that there's anything wrong with that.

It also doesn't hurt that we're both from the same general neck of the woods, Lon Ghiland. Which the natives shorten to The Ghiland. You have to hit that G, hard. I even had a very distant brush with fame once – a guy I used to play golf with, whose business was drilling precise holes for elevator shafts, told me he once drilled shafts for Jerry's converted car garage on the Upper West Side of Manhattan. Yes, that's right! Although I never got an invitation to see the result of his work.

At first, I thought the book was a joke. Because it reminded me immediately of one of my favorite bits on the series, Kramer's coffee table book on coffee tables. But that's another story. You see, I've seen every bite-size episode. I love it. The cars, the guests, the chatter, the revelations.

Of course, I've buried myself in the tome. And I'm proud to share some take-aways. Because God only knows how many copies of Comedians are out there, anywhere. Here's just a scrape of crema from the surface of the cup.

Jerry wrote an introduction to the book. "What if I figured out a way to bring the viewer along on a bit of comedy hang time but mostly the jokes and whatever else has some thought value? I'm not much for podcasts. I think virtually everything could do with a good edit a beautifully put together stand-up set is 'I have a lot of funny and interesting thoughts. Here's the best ones.'"

The episode with President Obama; "We did the phone call first. The President was like 'Yeah, come on over.' After

Obama hung up the phone, he said to the Secret Service agent who was in the office with him, 'He's going to knock on the window. Don't shoot him.'"

On relationships. Jerry to Bill Burr; "If I could give you three words of marriage advice? I'm married 14 years." All right. "Never stop apologizing."

More on relationships. Jerry to Ali Wentworth; "I'll tell you, your husband (George Stephanopoulos) has got one of the greatest husband lines I've ever heard. 'So you've moved to this new place on 72nd. Are you happy there? And he says I hope we are."

On TV and movies. Mel Brooks; "It's got to please you. You're the only audience. If it pleases you, it will please them. If you don't laugh, they're not going to laugh. If you don't cry, they're not going to cry."

On other comedians. Jay Leno; "When you're hot, whatever you do: 'Oh, ho, ho.' People laugh at everything you do. Then after they've seen you a few times, it gets a little trickier. Taste is what's left."

More on other comedians. Jerry to Howard Stern; "Listen, a great stand-up is a victory over the self. And you are as great an example as exists. Your career is a victory over the self. The greatest obstacles are the self. It wasn't the business. It wasn't other people. It wasn't relationships, your wife, whatever. None of that was the biggest obstacle. It was you. You conquered yourself."

Still more on other comedians: Robert Klein to Jerry about Rodney Dangerfield; "We'd hang around." Where? "His place, first on 86th. (In accent) I'll tell ya, I got an apartment on 86th, between Columbus and Puerto Rico. I got mugged there. The guy had a razor. It was an electric razor. It was my own fault. I was standing close to an outlet."

Back to Jerry's intro, on the cars; "... if you're not an automotive enthusiast, cars are an unbelievably boring subject... How a person could not be interested in cars, I'll never understand. They're such large, important, fascinating objects... They're such a perfect fit with the comedians and the coffee. The reason I love cars is each one's personality always expresses a moment in mechanical history and culture... Every car is so unique to me. And so much like a person. Always trying to please, so often failing.

I hope you find your very own Getting Coffee Book. I'm keeping mine, piping hot, forever.

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he cover of January 2024's edition of Nord Stern featured Mike Jekot's hood painting of a furious looking 911 racer breathing fire out of its back end. There's a story behind that car which might be of interest to most Porsche drivers.

The year was 1977 and the 935's were sweeping race after race in their Division 2 racing. Possibly because the outcomes were boring, the German sports channels were only covering races for smaller cars—mostly Division 1 BMW's, Fords, and Lolas. Ernst Fuhrmann and other leaders at Porsche couldn't take it any longer and on April 5th ordered the construction of a race car which could compete

with a smaller engine in Division 1.

The engineers decided on a 1.4 L air cooled engine with a single turbo to run in the 2 L class. Weight restrictions limited the car to 1,600 pounds, 141 pounds less than the lightest 911 that had ever been built. Thinner steel, glass and plastic were used to save weight. The oil cooler was moved from the front to the rear. They even used titanium for the

gas pedal and

gearshift lever to save a few more ounces.

Nicknamed the "Baby", the car did a few laps at Weissach

and then went to Nuremberg for its first race only a few months after its conception. Martini striping was used on a white background, just as Mike Jekot painted it. They qualified only 13th and multiple problems had to be sorted out.

The work was done in time for it to return for the German Grand Prix in August. Here Jacky Ickx qualified for pole position by more than two seconds and finished a half lap ahead of the competition. As Karl Ludvigsen wrote, "Porsche proved its point..that it could win in any class if it wanted to". Porsche immediately retired the Baby to its museum in Stuttgart after this one race victory.





Tech Session: Carsmotology March 30 . . . Detailing by the Expert!







Nord Stern MARCH 2024

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Rolex 24 . . . 19 + 19, a 55-year Drought Over . . . Onto Le Mans

t's the annual start to the sports car racing season; I started going to the Rolex 24 back in 1988. Much has continued to evolve over the decades. Qualifying, now called The Roar Before the 24, occurs on the previous Sunday. Of course, I was there. In the headline class, "Grand Touring Prototype" (GTP) there were four Porsche 963's, two Cadillac's, two BMW's, and two Acura's. This reminded me of history - especially 40 years ago - when there were more Porsche's on the grid than any other brand. That's an edge, especially for an endurance race. The results? The qualifying lap record fell by nearly a second. There were two Cadillac's on the front row, but the whole GTP field was covered by 8/10ths of a second. That's beyond extremely close and heralded an epic competition. The #77 (992) Porsche GT-3 R took the pole in GTD Pro, so there was reason for P-car fans to celebrate.

That leaves a few "flex" days until the action restarts. I spent one of those days at Champion Porsche, the largest Porsche dealer in the USA. They always have special cars right on their floor, ones that we often don't get to routinely see, like the Sport Classic, GT-3 RS, and Porsche Design specials. I still marvel at them winning Le Mans Overall back in 2005; they proudly display that trophy. I

enjoyed looking through some of the special Porsche color samples, etc. Later I stopped and visited friends at RENNtech, a team I drove for back in the 90's; they are still a premier Mercedes tuner in the USA.



I pointed the BMW 5er back north for the 160 miles to

Daytona. Just the right vehicle for the week. A freeway flyin' 500-mile day trip with the two stops, and later to carry lots of folks going to the track and the airport. My thanks to SIXT, as they have far more European vehicles available than other companies at MCO. A German sport sedan met both my wants and needs.

Wednesday evening there is a special street party. I think it's a clever promotion by the track and IMSA. They bring examples of the race cars out of the track and have a big event in an openair mall area at One Daytona, directly across from Daytona International Speedway. No ticket required; anybody and everybody is invited. Inclusion can be an under-utilized principle? There are pit stop contests for three crews, and one of those was JDC motorsports, with their Porsche 963. The livery for #77 Porsche in





GTD Pro was already viral, it was displayed too. Tomorrow, it's "game on" for four days of racing.

We had amazing weather this year. 70's nearly every day, and no rain. Basking in the glow of the sun and listening to the eager engine sounds echoing off the banking. This is the center of the motorsports universe this week every year. There were ten of us.

Once you really get 100 octane in the bloodstream, it doesn't get out!

We got our wristbands for the PCA tent at Turn #4. A great perk: seating, two big screens to watch the live TV feed, refreshments, and meeting PCA friends, like Kim and Keith Fritze's. The first big race is the



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IMSA Michelin Pilot Challenge, a four-hour race for GS (GT-4) and TCR cars on Friday afternoon. The #91 Cayman GT-4 RS Clubsport wins the GS Class, beating many V8 entries such as M-B, Aston Martin plus McLaren and BMW. And? The crew of JDC team in TCR does miracle work with their Audi RS 3 LMS in TCR . . . explain? They had problems, missing all of practice and qualifying . . . they needed a new ECU. Apparently, the nearest one was in Mexico! Urgent arrangements were made and the team barely made it to the grid. They had to start from the back, of course. Passing the entire field, they made it stick in the end, winning TCR. Two big victories!

Friday night, I had a special invitation. If you don't want to hear about a big V8 sedan with a manual transmission, it might be best if you quickly advance to the next paragraph. You wonder if there is even such a car still made? Nearly everything with a big engine now has a double-clutch or automatic. But there is one hold out to tradition. There is a special unveiling held at the Hall of Fame Museum inside the D.I.S. HQ building. H.O.F. is a stop worth it all by itself. Da, da. It's the 2025 Cadillac CT5-V Blackwing. 668 supercharged V8 horsepower and a six-speed manual transmission . . . and a nice interior, too. I give them credit for continuing to build this kind of velvet-hammer kind of vehicle when the usual-suspect



brands have stopped doing so.

We're back early on Saturday; it's the really Big Day. Early on, the historic cars will do a few display laps; I remember a lot of these old war horses in their prime and intend to enjoy hearing them out on

the track once again.

From 1981 through 1987 Porsche won Le Mans overall 7 times in a row, first with the 936, then the 956, and finally the all-conquering





962. Things change, especially the rule book. In the 90's the GTP Class was going to be replaced by GT1. Meanwhile, in 1993, one of the 962 teams, Dauer, set out to make street-legal cars out of the 962. Porsche had concluded that the standard 962 was no longer competitive with the new rules set. There wasn't time to make a 993-based version to align with the new GT1 rules, which would be the eventual answer. In the meantime? With a whole new body from Lola Composites and a real interior, Dauer had somehow gotten a version of the 962 made road legal in Europe . . . it was designated "962LM." Porsche saw this as the loophole . . . this "street legal" 962 could run competitively in GT1, that allowed a 650 hp engine instead of a 550 hp one and allowed a 31.7 gallon fuel tank instead 13.7 gallons. More power, far fewer pit stops for fuel . . . game on. Two cars were entered at the '94 Le Mans race, with a few grumbles from the ACO, the sanctioning body. In this guise, the "old" 962 won Le Mans just one more time. The Sultan of Brunei loved it, and apparently bought five from Dauer at \$1.2M each (mid-90's dollars.)

There I was at this year's Rolex 24, and one of those two Dauer 962's from the '94 Le Mans race was there. One of the actual



drivers, Danny Sullivan (photo right, LtoR Danny Sullivan, Paul Cole). I was enjoying the sounds of these cars lapping - and then there was an incident. The safety/ pace car for these display laps, a new BMW M3CS, hit the wall on the backstretch, two people went to the

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hospital. That brought this session to a halt. I leave you to the internet for photos of that debacle. Afterward, Paul and I discussed some racing history through Indy and CanAm with Danny. Later we do the grid walk, which is time to meet old friends, including team owners and drivers. What's their outlook? It will be show-and-tell time soon; those intentions and predictions will be tested. As we head back to the



condo, there is a great sunset framing the grandstands.

The next morning, I was looking out of the floor-to-ceiling glass of the Ocean Walk condo at an amazing ocean sunrise; what a



great planet we have; we are so fortunate. There was a magnificence that set a tone for the day. Back to the track, and there have been a few casualties overnight. The PCA tent serves as our "HQ," and at noon, we are served a choice of Panera box lunches.

Thank you, Porsche of Melbourne! There is a special event poster and a live painting, which depicts Porsche at this race. Later it's auctioned for the Austin Hatcher

Foundation. I won't spend as much time

on the nitty-gritty of race details; in today's hyperconnected world you likely know them already . . . if you want to know. What's the context?

As expected,



it's extremely close in GTP. The lead had changed many times, with nobody getting very far ahead. This would be a fight right to the end. The #6 Penske Porsche has suffered some penalties, as these cars as closely measured and monitored by IMSA in real-time. It seemed those violations



occurred under braking and recharging the hybrid battery. The team caught on fast and implemented software changes on #7, and the info went to the two other Porsche 963's. As it came to the penultimate hour, one of the Cadillac's and the "#7 963 were trading the lead. The last pit stop and last yellow flag were crucial elements . . . with just over two seconds to spare, the 963 wins. It was the 19th time for Porsche to Win Overall at Daytona . . . exactly matching their same count for Le Mans: 19. The #62 Risi Ferrari took GTD Pro, with the #77 Porsche only one lap back. The #57 Mercedes took the win in GTD "AM."

In the Winner's Circle, Roger Penske noted the end of the 55-year drought, that he had last won this race in 1969. That was with a Lola T-70, and that year, the winning margin was? 20 LAPS. Think about how much the competitive level has increased . . . now a 2 SECOND margin is more typical. His comments also made it firmly clear his sights are set on the Circuit de la Sarthe and June . . . Le Mans is a big race that he has yet to win. At 86, you can see that the flame still burns strong in him. If efforts can be redoubled in any way, they will be. There was a little faux pax by officials . . . they threw the white flag one lap too early. So it was actually the 23:58:24.723 this year . . . just shy of the 24. See you at the PCA tent next year?

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
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
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
