

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

Fatih Yucebilgic Minneapolis, MN 2014 911 Carrera 4S Cabriolet So, Just What Do We Do In Nord Stern??! A brief synopsis of activities and events offered by your club, Nord Stern, and/or PCA or, just enough info to pique your interest??!!

AUTOCROSS: A low-speed driving event teaches a person how to maneuver one's car through a course marked by pylons on a closed circuit. Instruction is often available, and drivers compete against the clock. No modifications to one's car are necessary. Helmet required.

CLUBTALK: This is an email-based list server for member subscribers focusing on car issues and discussions and a place to ask questions, get recommendations and comments. Alsolast minute breaking news on upcoming events and activities. Join Clubtalk at this link.

CAR SHOWS/CONCOURS: Members enjoy gathering and looking over a wide range of Porsche models, most nicely detailed to show them at their best. A generally informal and social setting.

- All Porsche Show: Nord Stern annually hosts the All Porsche Show in late June. One of the biggest events of the year, often with 150+ cars in attendance. A non-judged, "shine and show" event that attracts members and their families, along with prospective members.
- **Concours**: A setting where Porsches are displayed for general viewing and/or inspection, with competition in many distinct model categories. Experienced judges evaluate the various models based on cleanliness, overall condition, and authenticity.

DRIVES: An organized drive over a planned scenic route, usually to a meeting spot that offers food, beverages, and space to socialize. Venues rotate among popular destinations that offer good amenities for Porsche enthusiasts.

DRIVER TRAINING (DT): A driver training course designed to teach and enhance high-speed driving skills and techniques on an actual race course. Training includes classroom sessions, on-track exercises, and supervised lapping sessions. Completion of "DT" is a Pre-Requisite for "DE" participation and is NOT to be confused with Driver Education events. Driver Training includes both Novice and Intermediate level options. A current Snell-rated helmet is required at a minimum.

DRIVER EDUCATION (DE): A high-speed driving event on a closed-course racetrack (Brainerd and Road America for example) where drivers are grouped according to prior experience and car capabilities. Lapping sessions allows our members to enjoy the full performance capabilities of their cars in a relatively safe, controlled environment. Instructors are generally available for novices. Prior Driver Training participation is required. A current Snell-rated helmet is required at a minimum.

PARADE LAPS: Typically held during lunch sessions at DT/DE/Club Racing events at closed-course racetracks, this controlled environment with a pace car provides participants an opportunity to take street cars on the track at highway speeds so that they can see what the course is like. Minors are permitted in state approved restraints and with a signed parental release.

PCA CLUB RACING: Wheel-to-wheel competition between drivers who hold PCA club racing licenses. There is a race class for every model Porsche. Safety modifications to your vehicle required. This national program is administrated and overseen by a volunteer, trained national staff. The PCA website has a full schedule of races and information. Prior race experience required and/or specific amount of Driver Education participation. Talk to our Chief Driving Instructor for further information.

RALLY: An event wherein a driver and co-driver complete a predetermined route along open roads following a specific set of navigational instructions. Can be a TDS (time-distance-speed) or a 'fun' rally. Social: Organized gatherings of club members, affiliates and family member to meet, eat, and socialize. Many different venues and activities are selected every year to bring members together.

TECH SESSIONS: Casual educational session spaning a wide range of topics from general maintenance, through Concours prep, performance enhancements , and general car/mechanical knowledge!

VOLUNTEERING: The club runs on volunteers! A great way to meet fellow members and get the most out of your membership. We exist because of members volunteering their time and talents to plan and execute our many events. With no paid staff, we depend entirely on volunteers to run our club and keep a calendar of interesting, well-planned activities. Whether its track events, social activities, tech, touring, tech sessions, car shows, or others, we have a place for you and many an opportunity to get involved.

ongratulations Nord Stern on an outstanding year for the club! Our season of events officially came to a close at the Checkered Flag party on October 12th at Buck Hill. Kudos to all the leadership, including the Board, Executive Committee and Committee Chairs, and the numerous volunteers for their tremendous work providing enriching experiences for our members in 2024. 





t's so funny, isn't it, how our Brit "cousins" are, as the saying goes, separated by a common language. And lane divider. I'll never forget the first time I visited the UK. I was 24, and I went as soon as I had enough money. Coming out of the clouds, on final approach to Heathrow, I stared down at ... my God, I saw, they really were driving on the other side of the road. I actually teared up.

The car enthusiasm, the events! Like the Goodwood Festival of Speed, and the Goodwood Reunion.

Let's take the Reunion first. To me, it's like a Brit car culture Halloween. At the Goodwood circuit. You know the routine? It's open solely to cars built between 1948 and 1966. And everyone, I mean everyone, drivers and visitors alike, dresses in period costume.

Motor Trend chronicled this year's Reunion recently. And I quote, "Among a sea of impossibly rare, inconceivably valuable machines driven at breakneck speeds, it was hard to pick favorites"

But they tried. Adrian Newey's Ford GT40. With a "shattered foglight cover (and) destroyed paint on the nose." Can you imagine, at the Monterey Historics? Or on the fairway at Pebble Beach?

A "Team Ikuzawa" Porsche 904. Driven by former F1 pilot Emanuele Piro and his son Goffredo.

And, let's talk about hands across the water, a 1963 Ford Galaxie 500 Lightweight, driven by racer Roman Dumas, "so huge it looked like a flying aircraft carrier compared to the tiny Minis that dotted the track around it."

I've watched endless in-car videos of the event on-line, too. Damon Hill manhandling a real, live Ferrari 250 GTO. Sawing at the wheel. Upshifting, downshifting, dicing with a race Cobra. Hey, that's a \$50 to \$70 million piece of art he's hustling around. It's crazy. And crazy good. Like watching Picasso paint, during his "blue" period, or Gauguin painting in Tahiti.

Part of what gets me is the soundtrack. I mean, we've all seen photos of these machines. But how many of us have heard them come off the page, heard what the Italians call "the wail of the banshee?" That's one reason why I like the Festival of Speed just as much. Here, the machines run up the "driveway" to Lord March's manor, Goodwood House.

And there's no particular time frame for the participants. Which means the wow factor is stuck on the rev limiter. Prewar Auto Union and Mercedes Grand Prix cars. Who knew what they actually sound like? Who's actually even seen one? Even in a museum?

Same for a Jaguar D-Type, an original Ferrari Testarossa. And so on. At events like this, they actually run them, in anger. And, for the price of admission, you can witness the sight.

I love it. I love the passion. I remember seeing a brand-new McLaren F1, resplendent in a showroom window facing Hyde Park. It sat there a long time. Someone told me the story of Larry Ellison buying an F1, going to the factory, getting fitted for his new ride ... and he never came back to pick it up. They were incredulous, the Brits.

Once the Brits I was working with found out how much of a car wingnut I was. They offered to take me to the Brooklands Motor Course. Of course, I jumped at the opportunity. Just outside of London, I found it to be a timeworn, shopworn time capsule. From 1908. Wrap your mind around that. And the banking was still there, or at least most of it was, except for the part that was torn down during World War II, in order to create an airplane runway, down the middle.

Now, name a dowdy, over-the-hill race track in the U.S. that's still standing, where, if the wind is right, you can still hear the ghosts of Blower Bentleys and SS100 Jaguars and Frazer-Nashes and MG Magnettes. Give up? Yeah, me too.

That's a key difference between the Brits and us. They're still at it. With reverence. Do they feel the sands of time? What sands of time?

And that's why I need to go back on an historic car-culture adventure, soon. Anyone with me?





1994 to 1998: Three concepts, four overall wins

Dauer 962 LM-GT – Porsche TWR WSC 95 – 911 GT1 – 911 GT1 '98: Surprise victory for the clever GT – renovated Spyder proves unbeatable – the first mid-engined 911 – triumph at the 50th anniversary of Porsche

or 1994 there are new technical regulations. Le Mans prototypes, Le Mans GT1 and Le Mans GT2 - these are the new classes in the order of the expected performance. Porsche engineers read the rule book carefully and discover that the 962 C can be modernised and modified to be eligible as a Le Mans GT1 race car, because the required street-legal version already exists: the Dauer 962. At Porsche, the Dauer 962 LM-GT is designed with a flat underbody, the required minimum weight of 1,000 kilograms, and narrower tyres (14 instead of 16 inch). Porsche is setting its sights on the GT1 class victory. But it turns out quite differently: With an hour to go, a Toyota prototype is in the lead - right behind are the two worksrun Dauer 962 LM-GT! When the Toyota disappears into the pits for repairs to the gearbox - Porsche sweeps to its 13th overall victory. The winning pilots: Yannick Dalmas, Mauro Baldi and Hurley Haywood. At the wheel of the second Porsche, Hans-Joachim Stuck, Thierry Boutsen and Danny Sullivan are flagged off in third behind the Toyota sports prototype. On the way to victory, Thierry Boutsen's adrenalin level shoots sky high while driving at 300 km/h: in pitch darkness in the Tertre Rouge corner his Xenon lights, used for the first time, suddenly give up the ghost briefly.

In 1995 the factory looks into the possibility of competing with sports cars in the USA and takes a break in Le Mans. Hans-Joachim Stuck, Thierry Boutsen and Christophe Bouchut drive a Kremer K8 Spyder fielded by Kremer Racing as the best Porsche to sixth place overall. Like the second-placed Courage C23 with Bob Wollek, Eric Hélary and Mario Andretti, the Spyder is powered by a 935 type engine that is also planted in the 962 C.

Porsche and Porsche customers return in 1996 to secure wins in all classes. Reinhold Joest has taken over the two exworks TWR WSC 95 sports prototypes intended for 1995. At his own cost, he modifies and optimises the aerodynamics with assistance from Weissach. Housed under the carbonfibre plastic body in the carbon fibre monocoque is an old acquaintance: the three-litre turbo of the 962. Manuel Reuter, Alexander Wurz and Davy Jones win the overall category with this Porsche. Amongst the LM GT1 as the highest Grand Touring class, the brand new 911 GT1 proves unbeatable with a double victory. Hans-Joachim Stuck, Bob Wollek and Thierry Boutsen win in the first mid-engined 911 followed by Karl Wendlinger, Yannick Dalmas and Scott Goodyear. At the same time, the two 911 score second and third in the overall rankings. The German Roock Racing team win the LM GT2 class with a 911 GT2.

With factory help, Reinhold Joest and his squad again give the 1996-winning Porsche TWR WSC 95 an overhaul for Le Mans 1997. In Weissach, the 911 GT1 - the near-winner of the previous year - also undergoes some fine tuning. The Porsche TWR WSC 95 and the GT1 are clear race favourites. On Sunday morning the 911 GT1 driven by Bob Wollek is in the lead when a drive shaft breaks at 7.45

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
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a.m. and the car hits the barriers. Victory eludes Bob, even at his 30th start. After 22 hours, the second 911 GT1 is running a clear first when the oil pipe breaks and the engine bay catches fire. Ralf Kelleners climbs out unharmed, but the race is over. The Porsche TWR WSC 95 of Joest Racing has battled hard against the two works vehicles over virtually the entire distance. Now the prototype is in the lead and Michele Alboreto, Stefan Johannson and Tom Kristensen win. This marks the fourth victory for Joest – and the 15th for Porsche.

In order to remain competitive in the prototype class, Porsche builds a new race car from scratch in 1998. The 911 GT1 '98 is the first vehicle to feature a carbon-fibre body developed by Porsche. The 3.2-litre twin-turbo is housed - like in the 911 GT1 - in front of the rear axle. Porsche faces extremely tough competition from Mercedes and Toyota. Toyota's prototype has been customer-made specifically for Le Mans. BMW, Nissan, Ferrari and McLaren have also brought strong race cars to the Circuit des 24 Heures. The race escalates into a duel between Porsche and Toyota. On Sunday morning it looks like the Japanese challenger will come out on top when a water pipe on Allan McNish's car breaks. Shortly afterwards, Joerg Mueller takes a romp over a chicane and damages the underbody. Both Porsche stand in the pits for a little over half an hour. The Toyota moves into the lead but is hampered by gearbox troubles. With 90 minutes until the flag, McNish is running 44 seconds behind the Toyota. Five minutes later McNish reports from the cockpit that the Toyota is beached on the side of the track. The do-or-die battle is over after almost 23 hours. Double victory for Porsche with Allan McNish, Laurent Aiello and Stéphane Ortelli ahead of Joerg Mueller, Uwe Alzen and Bob Wollek. It is a welcome and hard-won success to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the sports car make, Porsche.

eautiful and fast perfectly describes the Porsche 904 Carrera GTS, which was first presented in November 1963 on the Solitude ircuit near Stuttgart, clinched class victory in spring 1964 at Daytona, turned heads with a double win at the Targa Florio and scored a class win in the twolitre Grand Touring class at its Le Mans debut. Using a composite construction, F. A. Porsche created the 904 featuring a

steel frame and a glass-fibre reinforced plastic body. The use of plastic was a first for Porsche, hence in the construction they sought advice from aviation experts. Two bodyshells per day were laminated by hand at the Heinkel Flugzeug Bau GmbH in the German town of Speyer. Aside from its streamlined shape, what made the midengined race car so successful was its small frontal area of just 1.4 square metres and the Cd value of 0.33. Thanks to its different engine options, ranging from four to eight cylinders, the 904 Carrera GTS turned out to be very diverse. 106 units were mounted with a 180 hp (with racing exhaust) fourcylinder Carrera motor and fielded at Le Mans. Later, four vehicles received a 210 hp six-cylinder and two works-race cars were propelled by 240 hp eight-cylinder power units.


